Careers Programme 2022/23

Mary Webb School has developed a varied and engaging Careers Programme.

By the end of each academic year, pupils can expect to benefit from the following careers entitlements:

Year 7 Careers Entitlement

- Students are encouraged to identify personal traits, strengths and skills and develop confidence and have high expectations of themselves.
- Students are introduced to careers resources through general library sessions
- Students are able to use the lunchtime drop-in careers support

Year 8 Careers Entitlement

- Students build on personal strengths and begin to link skills to specific careers.
- Students are encouraged to think about life after Mary Webb school and will all take part in groupwork during PSHE with the school Careers
 Adviser.
- Students are able to use the lunchtime drop-in careers support.
- Students are encouraged to use the range of careers resources available in the school library.

Year 9 Careers Entitlement

- Students are encouraged to reassess personal strengths with a focus on transferable skills. What is important in a career?
- Students are encouraged to investigate different jobs and careers and what this means in terms of the labour market, work patterns, working conditions and financial reward.
- Students are encouraged to use the full range of careers resources available to them including both web-based and physical resources.

 Students are introduced to the CASCAID software
- Students and their parents are encouraged to attend the school Careers Fair to talk to a range of employers, and Further Education/Higher Education providers.
- Students are encouraged to challenge stereotypes within the world of work and traditional job roles.
- Students have at least one face-to-face meeting with an independent and impartial Careers Adviser either in a small group, or individually
 according to need.
- Students will have the knowledge and understanding to choose GCSEs which fit with their aspirations and keep options open for future career interests

Year 10 Careers Entitlement

- Students begin to explore the full range of post-16 options. Economic awareness is developed, with the use of Labour market information as students are encouraged to think about employability, to identify and set themselves realistic future goals.
- Students meet with an independent and impartial Careers Adviser and agree a personal action plan.
- Students begin CV and cover letter writing.
- Students have optional access to additional independent and impartial advice via weekly drop in sessions.
- Students are increasingly signposted to career-specific websites which fit with their developing ideas, as well as the wide range of general resources available in school.
- Students and parents/carers are encouraged to attend the school Careers Fair
- Students complete work experience and record the learning from this using a work experience diary.

Year 11 Careers Entitlement

- Students are supported with their post 16 choices and encouraged to consider all available options including local colleges, apprenticeships and study programmes. Interview techniques further developed.
- Students continue to be signposted to career-specific websites which fit with their developing ideas, as well as the wide range of general resources available in school.
- Students have further careers interviews, which may be offered in small groups or as individual meetings according to need identified in year 10, and personal preferences. Personal guidance will support students to identify a first choice and back-up plan. Personal action plans will be updated.
- Students and parents/carers are encouraged to attend the school Careers Fair
- Students attend careers talks, fairs, college open days and taster days with employers held locally.
- Students are assisted further with CV writing and encouraged to have a completed a CV and cover letter
- Students have the option to attend specific apprenticeship sessions which cover applications and finding employers.
- Students are kept up to date with post 16 deadlines.
- Students have additional optional access to the school Careers Adviser via drop in sessions.

As we move through the school year, pupils in all year groups can expect to get involved in a range of activities:
