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Dear Parents and Carers,

Now that Year 11 students have returned we wanted to share important examination and assessment information with you. We have explained to students the importance of engaging with school work, cooperation and trying their very best between now and when they leave. Whilst we are still waiting final confirmation from exam boards relating to the processes and requirements for evidence, we thought it best to update you on what action we are taking in anticipation of further announcements. Please would you read this letter with your child.

Student GCSE results will be teacher assessed grades

Teachers have been instructed to award grades for every student on the basis of the level they are performing at, rather than what they would predict a student would have achieved had they sat exams in normal conditions. To meet the deadline set by Ofqual and the exam boards, we need to ensure all work that the grades are based on is moderated by 11th June 2021. This means that a portfolio of evidence for every student, for individual subjects, will need to be collated and marked in time to provide the evidence to support each grade, prior to submission. This portfolio will include work already undertaken (where appropriate) as well as evidence of a student's ability, which will be assessed from now until the end of May. Evidence could include coursework, classwork, exams or tests and may vary from subject to subject and student to student, depending on their performance in each task. You should also be reassured to know students have been continually assessed whilst in school, and this year have sat interim assessments in October and Mock examinations in December.

In addition to the above we have planned our own assessment window in the summer term where students will sit short pieces of work to ensure they have every chance to demonstrate their ability. They will take place in lessons, and those with access arrangements will be accommodated, to ensure they are given the correct level of support (see below for assessment details).

Quality Assurance

There will be both internal and external (from the exam boards) quality assurance processes. We have planned our own internal moderation processes. Exam boards will sample schools to scrutinise these processes and the quality of work supporting a predicted grade to ensure there is rigour and consistency in the national approach to the awarding of GCSE grades. This checking process will ensure there is no grade inflation and the grade submitted is supported by full and thorough evidence. We, therefore, will need to ensure our internal moderation processes are standardised and fair.

Appeals process

GCSE exam results day has been brought forward to 12th August. Students will not know their final grades until this day. Schools will handle any appeals in the first instance, but these can be escalated to the exam boards. Ofqual have been very clear that an appeal could only take place if a student feels there has been an administrative error on submission of their grade, especially if a school has followed exam board instructions on implementing a full and thorough internal moderation and standardisation process. An appeal is unlikely to change a final grade.

I hope this gives you a clear overview of some of the key points - crucially the message for students is keep engaging, cooperating and producing work to the best of their ability. Please be assured we will make sure all students are supported through this process - they will be given advice and the opportunity to improve or provide the evidence necessary. Indeed, if concerns arise regarding student progress we will contact parents to make them aware.

We are still awaiting further information about the finish date for Year 11, however it is highly unlikely students will be required to attend beyond Friday 11th June 2021.
