MEDICATION FOR STUDENTS



Please remember if you are sending medication into school for a student, it must be accompanied by an 'Administration of Medicine' consent form. This form is available to download from our website under 'Letters and Downloadable Forms', or can be collected from the School Office.

All medication must be in the original container and have the student's name on the prescription label. Medication must be handed into Reception where it will be stored safely.

Students are not permitted to carry medication.

The only exceptions are inhalers and epipens, for which we hold consent forms.

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Lulu feels inspired to help save our planet



Lulu meticulously planned Shropshire's first Climate Change Awareness Fair at her school

A school pupil has raised more than £650 for a climate group after being inspired to hold her own awareness fair.

Watching Sir David Attenborough's television programmes and reading Greta Thunberg's books inspired 13-year-old Mary Webb School pupil Lulu Reynolds to do her bit to help the planet she lives on. On her own initiative – with a little help from the adults around her – she meticulously planned Shropshire's first Climate Change Awareness Fair, which took place at the school on Sunday. Money raised at the event is being do-

nated to the Pontesbury Climate Emergency Action Group. It included a number of expert talks and stalls, with advice and examples of what people can do practically to help tackle climate change.

Lulu said: "I admire Greta enormously and David Attenborough really cares about the world with the core of his heart.

"His television programmes helped me realise just how beautiful the earth is. It is an incredible planet, and yet we're destroying it. We've reached a turning point, but we still have time, if we act now." Amongst the speakers at the event

were Paul King, talking about the prospect of achieving absolute zero carbon pollution.

Other speakers included Jonathan Walton, who was involved in some of the earliest climate change research in The Antarctic, Natural Gardener Nancy Lowe, on the secrets of creating a wildlife garden, and environmental artist Sara Mai, who works through the medium of plastic bottle tops.

Lulu said she hoped the fair was informative and could help people live a more environmentally conscious lifestyle. She said: "We must help the planet now."
