As you have now started Year 11, we want to help you make an informed choice for your next steps after you leave school. You are able to choose to study at college or in a school sixth form, or become an apprentice. 



In the notes field please enter the subject and whether it is a revision guide or workbook, and if the tier is Foundation or Higher. This will ensure the correct book is allocated to the student.

The price will always default to £10.50, please amend this to the correct amount from the latest price list within the Newsletter to ensure you are always paying the correct amount.

If you wish to buy more than one book a new transaction is required each time.

Talking about wee and poo - parent / carer event

Talking about wee and poo - 19th September 2024, 7pm

Join us for our parent and carer webinar, led by our Helpline Advisors looking at common bowel and bladder problems that children experience and how you can help overcome and manage them.

Our Helpline team will help you to understand how the bowel works, what can go wrong and what to do about it.

The session will include recognising constipation, and the importance of treatment, as well as working towards getting the poo in the loo!

We will explain how the bladder works, look at why it is essential to sort the bowels first, and why it is so important to have plenty to drink.

We will talk about how to recognise when the bladder is misbehaving, and what to do about it, plus ways to encourage your child towards the potty or toilet.

Workshops provide parents and carers with the opportunity to meet other families in similar situations and to gain tips on how to support a better night's sleep for them and their child.

You can choose to attend an online, face-to-face, or a special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) specific group.
