Dear Parent/Carer,

Through our science specialism, we are offering GCSE Astronomy as an extra-curricular option to the current Year 8 and 9 students. Your child has expressed an interest in studying astronomy so I would like to take this opportunity to explain the nature, demands and expectations of the course before any student formally signs up to the course.

The course starts on Wednesday 10th September 2025 and runs until May/June of 2027, depending on examination timetables. Lessons take place Wednesdays from 3:30 to 5:00pm, so students must be free and committed to attend all lessons. Lessons are like all lessons at Mary Webb School, where students will carry out various tasks to explore the wide-ranging concepts from the Edexcel GCSE Astronomy syllabus. Students will be expected to carry out written tasks as well as drawing diagrams and graphs, tabulating data and calculating astronomical quantities. For this, they are expected to bring their usual lesson equipment.

Students will be set a target for the course, usually in line with their GCSE Science (for core students) or GCSE Physics (for triple students) target. Astronomy fits with all the other Science qualifications so the exam board awards grades from 1 to 9. Students will be assessed against this target through their written work, in class testing and mock exams, to be reported on through our normal reporting procedures. The expectation is that students work towards their target in Astronomy as they would for any other examination course.

The exam board assess the students in two externally set examination papers at the end of the 2 year course. Each paper will take 1 hour 45 minutes and will contribute 50% of the overall grade. Students are expected to revise through structured homework and independently to prepare for these examinations, along with their other GCSE examinations.

Students will complete at least two observational projects; one project will be a naked-eye observation, the other using an astronomical instrument. Students can use their own telescopes or binoculars for this but there is no requirement for the students to own this equipment as we sign them up to use a remote robotic telescope. Observations and written work for these projects will be done in class and at home. This written work will not contribute towards the GCSE but students will be asked about their project work during the terminal examinations.

Students will be set homework for GCSE Astronomy; this will include written work, mathematical analyses, background reading, watching videos, examination preparation, revision and carrying out observational tasks at suitable times. A lot of this work will be in preparation for the next week's lesson so it is of vital importance that students organise their time effectively and keep up to date with their work.

We believe this is an exciting and engaging course for committed students with an enthusiasm for physical sciences and astronomy in particular. If your child wishes to do the course, please let me know by email, gward@marywebbschool.com by Wednesday 21st May 2025. After this date, we will be able to confirm if numbers are sufficient for the course to run.

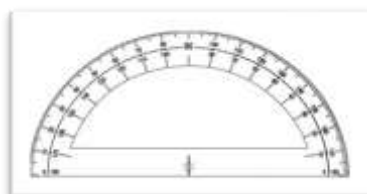
