Pila is an Alpine ski-resort in the Aosta Valley region of northern Italy, and only a few kilometres from the French/Italian border, it boasts some of the most stunning scenery in the Alps.

The 3\* Hotel le Château is situated in the village of Aymavilles, just 8km from Aosta, and at the foot of the Gran Paradiso National Park. The hotel is approximately 15/20 minutes away by coach from the Pila gondola.

All rooms are mostly for 2 or 3 people and all have private facilities, hairdryers, telephone and colour TV.

Behaviour prior to the trip will need to be exemplary to ensure the safety and enjoyment of all students, and to allow the trip to run safely and successfully, all students must be prepared to abide by the school's behaviour code.

Shropshire Council is working in partnership to run an exciting holiday programme this Summer, Shropshire HAF (Holiday Activities and Food).

Take part in sports, arts, cooking, forest schools and lots more fun activities, happening across the county. Free nutritious meals will be provided at each session.

There are free places available on the programme for children and young people aged 4 (in reception class or equivalent) to 16, who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals.

There are a limited number of free places available for children and young people who are not in receipt of benefits-related free school meals but meet a wider eligibility

#### How to Book

Please book spaces directly with the organisations running the holiday clubs.

What you need to do:

- Book onto activity by contacting the organisation running the holiday club direct, using the contact details in the Quide.
- When making a booking, please quote your unique HAF Code (see box below).

Shropshire Early Help are looking for young people who are interested in taking part in the recruitment of those people who provide support to children, young people and families. You will:




